Washburn-Norlands Living History Center, Livermore, Maine

Friday, May 21

Arrive anytime after 3:00 PM for optional camping. Those who arrive early enough should anticipate “volunteering” for a few chores to help prepare the site for the June *Rally for Norlands* event.

Saturday, May 22

Infantry & Musicians - Be on site by 8:15 AM.

Civilians – Be on site by 9:00 AM.

- 8:30 – 9:00 Tent & shelter set-up instruction for raw recruits (Cpl. Nelson & Pioneer Cylik)
- 9:15 AM Unfurl colors and inspection
- 9:30 – 10:30 Squad training stations
The company will be divided into three squads and rotated through the following training and practice stations:
- manual of arms (Sgt. Peterson)
 - stacking of arms (Cpl. Nelson)
 - loading and firing (Sgt. Bray)*
- *Raw recruits will receive individualized musket safety and firing instruction training from Cpl. Henry during this time.
- 10:30 – 11:30 Marching drill & company firing practice (Capt. Lawson & all NCOs)
- 11:30 – 12:00 Camp etiquette and standards for camp living history impression (Capt. Lawson & Sgt. Bray)
- 12:00 – 12:30 Instruction in camp duties and assisting the cook (Sgt. Bray, Pioneer Cylik, & Chef Bray)
- 12:30 – 1:30 Lunch
- 1:30 – 2:00 Proper etiquette for ladies and gentlemen (Mrs. Lawson)
- 2:00 – 2:30 Bayonet drill (Capt. Lawson, Sgt. Bray & Sgt. Peterson)
- 2:30 – 3:00 Skirmish drill (Capt. Lawson, Sgt. Bray & Sgt. Peterson)
- 3:00 – 4:00 Skirmish through the woods
The company will be divided into two platoons, which will skirmish against each other. (Capt. Lawson & all NCOs)
- 4:00 – 4:30 Musket cleaning instruction for raw recruits (Cpl. Henry)
- 4:30 Final formation and furl colors
